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#### 1. VHHA in Action

Each day, VHHA actively works on behalf of its members, their employees, and Virginians to advance the interests of Virginia's hospitals and health care systems. In the past week, here are some developments of interest to Virginia hospitals and health systems:

- CrowdStrike has issued a <u>preliminary post-incident report</u> following the recent information technology system disruptions impacting organizations using Microsoft Windows. The company previously issued an <u>updated recovery tool</u> with repair options to assist IT administrators in the <u>remediation process</u>. In late July, organizations around the globe experienced Microsoft Windows information technology outages related to CrowdStrike software updates.
- The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recently issued final rules for the fiscal year (FY) 2025 <u>skilled nursing facility prospective payment system</u>, the FY 2025 <u>inpatient</u> <u>rehabilitation facility prospective payment system</u>, the FY 2025 <u>inpatient psychiatric facility</u> <u>prospective payment system</u>, and to update <u>hospice payment rates</u> for FY 2025.
- The Virginia Organization for Nurse Leaders (VONL) has scheduled its 2024 Fall Conference for Sept. 13 at The Westin Richmond. The conference theme is "Mastering the Canvas: Nursing Leadership in Practice." Continuing education credits are available to event participants. The five-day course provides education and training to professionals who work with sex trafficking survivors. The in-person training is free but participants must register in advance. It is scheduled for Sept. 16-20 (9 a.m.-4 p.m. daily) in Fredericksburg, VA. Participants are responsible for their own transportation, lodging, and meals. - In a recent <u>letter</u> to health care providers, **Virginia State Health Commissioner Dr. Karen Shelton**, MD, addresses the national shortage of Penicillin G benzathine (Bicillin L-A®) and treatment recommendations at a time of rising syphilis cases in Virginia, including early syphilis, late or unknown duration cases, as well as increases in ocular, otic, neurological, and congenital syphilis cases. The letter recommends health care professionals screen atrisk patients in accordance with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG). - The application window is open for the American Hospital Association (AHA) 2025 Quest for Quality Prize, which recognizes hospitals and health systems committed to leadership and innovation in improving quality and advancing health. Hospitals and health systems that are making significant progress toward providing exceptional care based on the National Academy of Medicine's six health aims safe, timely, effective, efficient, equitable and patient-centered care are encouraged to apply for the 2025 AHA Quest for Quality Prize. - The **U.S. Department of Justice** (DOJ) recently announced that a grand jury has indicted a North Korean, Rim Jong Hyok, regarding his alleged involvement in a conspiracy to hack and extort U.S. hospitals and health care providers for ransom and then launder those to fund additional global computer intrusions. The perpetrated ransomware attacks interfered with health care providers in rendering aid to patients. Read more here.

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### 3. Virginia Recognized as a Top State for Rural Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement

Virginia is one of the top states recognized in 2024 by the Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Project (MBQIP) from the federal **Health Resources & Services Administration** (HRSA). The goal of the MBQIP is to improve the quality of care patients receive in critical access hospitals (CAH), which are modest-sized federally-designated health care facilities serving remote rural communities. Virginia has eight CAHs. The MBQIP focuses efforts in the 45 states that participate in the Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility Program; MBQIP works with 1,360 CAHs to measure data for quality improvement efforts in areas such as patient safety, outpatient care, patient engagement, and care transitions. For 2024, Virginia was ranked number two among the top states "who achieved the highest reporting rates and levels of improvement in CAHs over the past 12 months." Read more here.

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# 7. Blood Culture Vial Supply Shortages Persist, FDA and CDC Offer Guidance

**Beckton Dickinson** is experiencing reduced availability of BACTEC blood culture media bottles due to supplier issues. The firm anticipates relief in these supplier issues in September, according to an informational <u>website</u> providing updates on the situation. In response to interruptions in the supply of BD BACTEC blood culture media bottles, the **U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) is recommending that laboratories and health care providers consider conservation strategies to prioritize the use of blood culture media bottles, preserving available supplies for patients at highest risk. Current supply challenges may impact patient diagnosis, follow-up patient management, and antimicrobial stewardship efforts. A list of specific conservation recommendations is available <u>here</u>. In related news, the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention** (CDC) has also issued an advisory alerting health care providers, laboratory professionals, and others in health care settings of a critical shortage of Becton Dickinson BACTEC blood culture bottles.
