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1. VHHA in Action

Each day, VHHA actively works on behalf of its members, their employees, and Virginians to advance the interests of Virginia's hospitals and health care systems. In the past week, here are some developments of interest to Virginia hospitals and health systems:

- This week, VHHA held a meeting of the Healthcare Safety & Security Workgroup, whose members include hospital safety and security leaders focused on sharing experiences, ideas, and best practices regarding current and future safety, security, violence prevention, and response activities in Virginia hospitals and health systems. - VHHA held a meeting of the Payor Advisory Committee this week. The Committee is a
 forum for hospital payor relations and revenue cycle leaders to discuss priority issues and
 ongoing payor-related challenges. Contact Craig Connors at cconnors@vhha.com to inquire

- This week, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved and granted emergency use authorization (EUA) for updated mRNA COVID-19 vaccines manufactured by ModernaTX Inc. and Pfizer Inc. that include a monovalent component corresponding to the Omicron variant KP.2 strain of SARS-CoV-2. The 2024-2025 vaccines have been updated to more closely target circulating variants and protect against serious impacts of contracting COVID-19 such as hospitalization and death. Read more here.
- The **World Health Organization** (WHO) recently <u>declared</u> a global health emergency due to "the upsurge of mpox in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and a growing number of countries in Africa." It is the second such determination in two years' time due to mpox.
- The White House, through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), is pressing health insurance companies to enhance consumers experience by providing more

- straightforward information about coverage and making claims and appeals processes less burdensome, with a particular focus on easing claims and appeals processes. Read a letter from federal officials to health insurance company leaders here.
- The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recently issued a report summarizing data on submitted complaints and enforcement action pertaining to applicable sections of the Public Health Service Act through June 30, 2024. CMS has received more than 16,000 complaints, many of which are related to provisions of the No Surprises Act. Read more here.
- The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has extended the application submission deadline for the ACO Primary Care Flex Model (ACO PC Flex Model) through Aug. 23 to provide applicants with more time to make submissions. The ACO Primary Care Flex Model (ACO PC Flex Model) is a voluntary model that will focus on primary care delivery in the Medicare Shared Savings Program. It will test how prospective payments and increased funding for primary care in accountable care organizations (ACO) impact health outcomes, quality, and costs of care. The flexible payment design will empower participating ACOs and their primary care providers to use more innovative, team-based, person-centered and proactive approaches to care. The model, which starts Jan. 1, 2025, aims to grow participation in ACOs and the Shared Savings Program and increase the number of people with Medicare in an accountable care relationship. - Several national organizations have sounded a warning about blood shortages, including the
 <u>American Red Cross</u>, which reported an "emergency" 25 percent decline in the national
 blood inventory. Groups like the <u>Association for the Advancement of Blood and Biotherapies</u>
 and <u>America's Blood Centers</u> are urging people to donate blood to help replenish supplies
 amid the ongoing shortage.

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7. CDC Issues Warning on Threat of Human Parovirus B19

The **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention** (CDC) recently shared a health alert network (HAN) health advisory to alert health care providers, public health agencies, and public audiences about documented increases in human parvovirus B19 activity in the United States. Parvovirus B19 is a seasonal respiratory virus. The CDC indicates there has been an observed uptick of viral cases in Europe, as well as increasing activity in the U.S. Read more here.

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9. Federal District Court Blocks Enforcement of FTC Non-Compete Final Rule

A <u>ruling</u> issued this week by the **U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas** effectively blocks the implementation of a final rule from the **Federal Trade Commission** (FTC) that would have prohibited many employers from entering into non-compete contracts with employees. In July, the court <u>granted a</u>

motion for a preliminary injunction that postponed the effective date of the FTC final rule issued earlier this year that would have made many non-compete agreements unenforceable. Organizations including the **U.S. Chamber of Commerce** pursued litigation challenging the final rule, which had an effective date of Sept. 4. Under the previous standard, non-compete contract language could prohibit workers from pursuing some other employment opportunities.
