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#### 1. VHHA in Action

Each day, VHHA actively works on behalf of its members, their employees, and Virginians to advance the interests of Virginia's hospitals and health care systems. In the past week, here are some developments of interest to Virginia hospitals and health systems:

- This week, VHHA hosted a quarterly public health webinar series for Virginia hospitals and health systems. The webinar series is hosted by VHHA in collaboration with Virginia
   Department of Health (VDH) officials who provide updates on key topics including disease surveillance, modeling, influenza, RSV, and unique pathogens, among others. View presentation slides <a href="here">here</a> and a webinar recording through this <a href="hill.">link</a>.
- This week, the VHHA Center for Healthcare Excellence hosted an in-person quality and safety symposium that brought together Virginia hospital and health system quality, safety, and clinical leaders. The event focused on the current state of health care quality and safety in the Commonwealth as well as approaches to developing collaborative improvement opportunities for the future. Sentara Leigh Hospital President Joanne Inman, a VHHA Board Member and the Chair of VHHA Center for Healthcare Excellence Advisory Council, moderated the event held at VHHA offices in Glen Allen, VA. - The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) recently <u>announced</u> that the
   Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network (OPTN) Board of Directors, which is the
   governing body that establishes national organ allocation policy, is separately incorporated
   and independent of the Board of the long-standing OPTN contractor: the Richmond, VA based United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS). The American Institutes for Research has
   been awarded a contract to support the OPTN Board. Read more <a href="here">here</a>.

- The 2024-2025 Respiratory Disease Season Outlook from the **Centers for Disease Control** and **Prevention** (CDC) projects a "similar or lower number of combined peak hospitalizations" from COVID-19, influenza, and RSV compared to last season. Read more here.
- The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recently approved a new indication for ACAM2000 as a treatment for mpox disease prevention in individuals at high risk for infection. Previously, ACAM2000 was approved for smallpox disease prevention in high-risk individuals. ACAM2000 is a live replicating vaccinia virus vaccine. People who receive ACAM2000 are required to receive the medication guide approved by FDA regarding safe and effective use of the vaccine to help prevent serious adverse events and to inform vaccine recipients of serious risks relative to benefits that could affect their personal health decisions.
- VHHA recently produced a <u>new video</u> featuring the community health workers from Sentara Health and VCU Health explaining the importance of their work as a bridge to help build trust and relationships between patients in disadvantaged or under-served communities and clinicians and the health care delivery system more broadly. The video was shared in recognition of <u>National Community Health Worker Awareness Week</u> (Aug. 26-30), which is an event focused on public education regarding the role and work of CHWs, their impact on communities, and more. The VHHA Foundation supports certain hospital-based CHW programs through a grant sub-award from the Institute for Public Health Innovation (IPHI), supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) of the U.S Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).
- In a recent letter to health care providers, Virginia State Health Commissioner Dr. Karen Shelton shared updates regarding Virginia Department of Health (VDH) communicable disease observations including: an increase in pertussis (whooping cough) cases, monitoring activities for an outbreak of the pathogenic avian influenza in poultry and dairy cattle, an uptick in reporting of invasive Group A Streptococcus (iGAS) cases and outbreaks across Virginia in recent years, and the ongoing mpox outbreak in Africa. - The Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), the Federal Bureau of
  Investigation (FBI), and the Department of Defense Cyber Crime Center (DC3) recently
  issued a joint advisory about efforts by a group of Iran-based cyber actors to target U.S.
  organizations, including those in the health care sector, to access computer networks and
  deploy ransomware attacks. Read more here.
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently shared a health alert network (HAN) health advisory to alert health care providers, public health agencies, and public audiences about documented increases in human parvovirus B19 activity in the United States. Parvovirus B19 is a seasonal respiratory virus. The CDC indicates there has been an observed uptick of viral cases in Europe, as well as increasing activity in the U.S. Read more here.

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# 3. Nominate a Hospital Leader for 2024 VHHA Outstanding Service Awards

Now is the time to submit nominations for the **2024 VHHA Outstanding Service Awards**. The awards recognize individuals who have made a real difference to Virginia's hospitals and health systems, and to health care in general, through selfless, energetic, and passionate service. Awards are presented in the following categories: the Distinguished Service Award, the Meritorious Service Award, and the Excellence in Governance Award. Each award recognizes those who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to contribute to Virginia's hospitals and health systems.

- The **Distinguished Service Award** is given to past or present chief executive officers of member institutions who have long records of performing outstanding, valuable, and unique services to the hospital and health system community.
- The Meritorious Service Award honors people other than chief executive officers affiliated with member institutions who have a history of making significant contributions to the health care field on both a state and local level through commitment to service and leadership. Nominees must be recognized as leaders in health care management and policy issues and be involved in health care from the perspective of management or providing support for delivering health care services.
- The Excellence in Governance Award honors people from member hospital or health system governing bodies who have a history of making significant contributions to the health care field – on both a state and local level – through commitment to service and leadership. Nominees must be or have been involved in health care from the governance perspective.

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### 4. September is National Suicide Prevention Month

September is National Suicide Prevention Month. Data from the **Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration** (SAMHSA) shows that more than 13 million adults seriously thought about

suicide last year, nearly four million planned a suicide attempt, and nearly two million attempted suicide. And the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention** (CDC) reports that suicide was the second-leading cause of death among youth and young adults. One resource available to those considering self-harm is the <u>988 Lifeline</u>, a support phone line made up of a network of local crisis centers that provides free and confidential emotional support to people in suicidal crisis or emotional distress 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in the United States.

**Real Life**, a Richmond, VA-based organization that works with men and women exiting incarcerating who want to make positive change in their lives, is hosting the in-person "Beyond Gunshots: Pathways to Safer Communities" conference Sept. 16-17. The conference will feature speakers and presentations focused on research, trends, and evidence-based strategies to strengthen public safety and reduce community violence. 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### 7. VNPC Recruiting Hospitals for Perinatal Mental Health Quality Improvement Project

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## 9. FDA Grants Approval to Updated Novavax COVID-19 Vaccine

The **U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) recently granted emergency use authorization (EUA) for an updated version of the Novavax COVID-19 vaccine that targets currently circulating viral variants and protects against serious consequences of COVID-19 such as hospitalization and death. The updated vaccine is authorized for use in individuals 12 and older. It includes a monovalent (single) component that corresponds to the Omicron variant JN.1 strain of SARS-CoV-2. The FDA previously granted EUA to updated formulations of the COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna.
