FDA Approves Extended Use of Some Baxter IV Products Amid Shortage

• The **U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) has authorized an extension of the expiration date of certain Baxter International Inc. IV solution products amid the ongoing shortage that is a result of storm damage to the company's Marion, NC facility, which has interrupted manufacturing operations. During this time, VHHA is convening calls with hospital chief medical officers, chief nursing officers, and pharmacy leaders regarding the reduced shipment allocation of IV fluid solution and peritoneal dialysis solution. VHHA is also working with member hospitals and state and federal partners in response to this evolving situation. Domestic-bound supply shipments from overseas Baxter production plants have been authorized. Baxter, which has been updating a webpage with information for clinical providers, recently announced that "barring any unanticipated developments" the firm "anticipates restarting the highest-throughput IV solutions manufacturing lines within the next week." The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is also sharing situational updates and recently hosted a webinar about conservation strategies, a recording of which can be viewed through this link. This week, Virginia State Health Commissioner Dr. Karen Shelton also distributed an updated letter to health care providers regarding the evolving situation.

• The VHHA Center for Healthcare Excellence recently hosted a webinar to provide updates from the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) Office of Licensure and Certification. The office administers state licensing programs for hospitals, outpatient surgical hospitals, nursing facilities, home care organizations, and hospice programs. It also conducts inspections to ensure compliance with state requirements, investigates consumer complaints, and evaluates compliance with state requirements. During the webinar, VDH staff shared insights gained from their inspection and survey activity in Virginia hospitals and health systems and discussed recent improvement initiatives that have been undertaken to make the licensing and survey process more efficient for health care facilities. CDC Recommends Second Dose of COVID-19 Vaccine for Older, Immunocompromised Individuals

The **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention** (CDC) recently <u>endorsed</u> a recommendation by the CDC **Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices** (ACIP) that people 65 and older and those who are immunocompromised should receive a second dose of 2024-2025 COVID-19 vaccine six months after a first dose.

ACA Marketplace Open Enrollment Period Begins Nov. 1

The open enrollment period for people to shop for 2025 health insurance plans through the Affordable Care Act's (ACA) <u>Health Insurance Marketplace</u> begins today (Friday, Nov. 1) and continues through Jan. 15, 2025. Consumers who select a plan by midnight Dec. 15 (5 a.m. EST on Dec. 16) can get full-year coverage starting Jan. 1, 2025. Those who select a plan after Dec. 15, 2024, but before the deadline, will have coverage that starts Feb. 1, 2025. The **Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services** (CMS) have an <u>open enrollment fact sheet</u> with more information. People can also shop for coverage through <u>Virginia's Insurance Marketplace</u>.

Medicare Open Enrollment Period Now Active

The annual open enrollment period for Medicare began Oct. 15 and continues through Dec. 7. Medicare-eligible individuals have the ability to check their enrollment status and choose or change plans (such as switching from Medicare Advantage and prescription drug plans to original Medicare) during the open enrollment period. In September, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) indicated that "average premiums, benefits, and plan choices for Medicare Advantage and the Medicare Part D prescription drug program are expected to remain stable in 2025." In related news, CMS recently issued a final rule that establishes appeals processes for some Medicare beneficiaries who are initially admitted for care as hospital inpatients but later reclassified as outpatients receiving observation services. The rule establishes retrospective and prospective appeal rights for Medicare beneficiaries seeking to appeal for coverage as inpatients.

VDH to Host Nov. 12 Webinar on Frontline Health Care Preparation for Marburg Virus Disease

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) is hosting a free webinar Nov. 12 at noon whose topic is the "Marburg Virus Disease: Preparation for Frontline Facilities." The webinar content will offer an update on Marburg virus disease (MVD) prevention efforts in the United States and Virginia, set expectations for level four (frontline) health care facilities caring for patients with suspected MVD, review infection prevention and control recommendations for managing a patient with suspected MVD, and provide resources and tools to aid in facility preparedness and situational awareness. The target audience includes frontline health care facility leaders such as infection preventionists, emergency department leadership, and facility administrators. Register for the webinar here. In related news, VDH and VHHA recently collaborated on a public health webinar about the current Marburg virus outbreak in Rwanda. MVD is a rare but highly fatal viral hemorrhagic fever (VHF) caused by infection with one of two zoonotic viruses: Marburg virus or Ravn virus.
