Each day, VHHA actively works on behalf of its members, their employees, and Virginians to advance the interests of Virginia's hospitals and health care systems. In the past week, here are some developments of interest to Virginia hospitals and health systems:

# **Baxter IV Solution Update**

 VHHA continued to convene calls with hospital chief medical officers, chief nursing officers, and pharmacy leaders this week regarding the reduced shipment allocation of IV fluid solution and peritoneal dialysis solution due to flooding and rain damage caused by Hurricane Helene at the Baxter International Inc. facility in Marion, NC. During the calls, members discussed conservation strategies and other response measures being pursued at this time. VHHA is working with member hospitals and state and federal partners in response to this evolving situation. Baxter has launched a <u>webpage</u> with information for clinical providers. Also, the **U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) recently issued <u>guidance for compounders</u> to help fill the gaps from the impact of Hurricane Helene on Baxter International's North Cove facility and the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention** (CDC) has <u>shared</u> a Health Alert Network (HAN) Health Advisory to inform health care providers about the supply disruption of peritoneal dialysis (PD) and intravenous (IV) solutions due to the Baxter situation and provide guidance on response strategies.

### **Healthcare Safety & Security Forum Meets**

• This week, VHHA held a virtual meeting of the Healthcare Safety & Security Forum, whose members include hospital safety and security leaders focused on sharing experiences, ideas, and best practices regarding current and future safety, security, violence prevention, and response activities in Virginia hospitals and health systems. # Webinar Recording: Potential Election Implications for Health Care

• The Virginia Healthcare Emergency Management Program (VHEMP) – a partnership between the Virginia Department of Health (VDH), VHHA, and the four regional healthcare coalitions – recently hosted a webinar focused on medical facility operational planning in the lead up to the 2024 election cycle and the role of medical intelligence in anticipating potential issues. Recent years have seen an increase in civil unrest events across the nation, which can unfortunately impact health care operations in several ways including the potential for mass casualty events. This year's elections have the potential to spark protests or other conduct that could have public health implications. #### **CMS Issues Final Rule on Medicare Outpatient Appeals Process**

The **Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services** (CMS) recently issued a <u>final rule</u> that establishes appeals processes for some Medicare beneficiaries who are initially admitted for care as hospital

inpatients but later reclassified as outpatients receiving observation services. The rule establishes retrospective and prospective appeal rights for Medicare beneficiaries seeking to appeal for coverage as inpatients.

#### Health Care Professionals Can Apply for Sorensen Institute Political Leaders Program by Nov. 12

The **Sorensen Institute for Political Leadership** at the **University of Virginia** has opened the application period for the 2025 Political Leader Program; the application window will close on Nov. 12. The previous class featured several VHHA-affiliated individuals – in 2020, VHHA <u>entered into a five-year partnership with Sorensen</u> to support its programming and help identify health care leaders who are strong candidates for the Political Leaders Program. Program participants are drawn from a diverse group of applicants from across the state, and will focus on Virginia politics and governing, policy issues and solutions, regional needs, ethical servant leadership, and efforts to unite the Commonwealth. This program is primarily focused on individuals who are 10-plus years removed from college. #### FDA Approves Treatment to Mitigate Bleeding Episodes in Hemophilia Patients

The **U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) recently <u>approved</u> Hympavzi (marstacimab-hncq) for routine prophylaxis to prevent or reduce the frequency of bleeding episodes in adult and pediatric patients 12 and older with hemophilia A without factor VIII inhibitors or hemophilia B without factor IX inhibitors (neutralizing antibodies). Hemophilia A and hemophilia B are genetic bleeding disorders. Patients with these conditions are unable to clot properly and may bleed for a longer time than normal after injury or surgery. They may also have spontaneous bleeding in muscles, joints and organs, which can be life-threatening. These bleeding episodes are typically managed by episodic treatment or prophylaxis. Rather than replacing a clotting factor, Hympavzi is a new type of drug that works by reducing the amount of the naturally occurring anticoagulation protein to help increase the amount of thrombin, an enzyme critical in blood clotting, to reduce or prevent the frequency of bleeding episodes.

Register for Oct. 23 Public Health Webinar Briefing for Virginia Hospitals on Marburg Virus

In collaboration with the Virginia Department of Health (VDH), VHHA will host a public health webinar on Oct. 23 at noon to provide hospital and health systems teams with a briefing on the current Marburg virus outbreak in Rwanda. Webinar topics will include a travel monitoring program being implemented at Dulles International Airport, efforts and preparedness activities VDH is undertaking, and updates and information specific to hospitals. The Marburg virus disease (MVD) is a rare but highly fatal viral hemorrhagic fever (VHF) caused by infection with one of two zoonotic viruses: Marburg virus or Ravn virus. Marburg virus and Ravn virus are in the virus family Filoviridae, which also includes Ebola viruses. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently issued a Health Alert Network (HAN) Health Advisory to inform clinicians about the Republic of Rwanda's first confirmed outbreak of MVD with 36 laboratory confirmed cases and 11 deaths reported as of Oct. 2, including at least 19 cases in health care workers. A person infected with the Marburg virus is not contagious before the appearance of symptoms, which may include fever, headache, muscle and joint pain, fatigue, loss of appetite, gastrointestinal symptoms, or unexplained bleeding. MVD is spread through direct contact with broken skin or mucous membranes with the body fluids of someone who is sick with MVD, or who recently died from their infection. It is not spread by airborne transmission. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has issued a fact sheet on MVD and Virginia State Health **Commissioner Dr. Karen Shelton** recently shared an <u>update</u> in a letter to clinicians.

The **Virginia Department of Health** (VDH), in collaboration with the **VHHA Center for Healthcare Excellence**, is hosting a webinar at 10:30 a.m. on Oct. 23 to provide updates from the VDH Office of Licensure and Certification. That office administers state licensing programs for hospitals, outpatient surgical hospitals, nursing facilities, home care organizations, and hospice programs. It also conducts inspections to ensure compliance with state requirements, investigates consumer complaints and evaluates compliance with state requirements. During the webinar, VDH staff will review insights gained from their inspection and survey activity in Virginia hospitals and health systems and discuss recent improvement initiatives have been have undertaken to make the licensing and survey process more
