- Baxter International Inc., a medtech firm, has announced that flooding and associated storm damage from Hurricane Helene has caused the closure of its largest manufacturing facility, located in North Carolina, that primarily manufactures intravenous and peritoneal dialysis solutions (the firm is said to be the largest U.S. manufacturer of those solutions).

- The Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) has contracted with Myers and Stauffer LLC to conduct the required five-year survey for the cost of dispensing prescriptions to Virginia Medicaid fee-for-service members. Meyers and Stauffer mailed and e-mailed the survey to pharmacy contacts on Sept. 12. The survey should have been mailed to hospital primary addresses and e-mails have been sent to

those registered in the DMAS pharmacy system through Gainwell. The survey is due back to Meyers and Stauffer by Oct. 17. - The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recently issued an interim final rule regarding the fiscal year (FY) 2025 hospital inpatient prospective payment system (PPS) low wage index policy. The proposal calls for discontinuing the low wage index policy. Public comments on the rule are being accepted until Nov. 29. Read more here.

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The Virginia Hospital & Healthcare Association (VHHA) recently received the 2024 Achievement in Performance Excellence Award from the U.S. Senate Productivity and Quality Award (SPQA) Program. The Performance Excellence Award signifies VHHA's continuing work and achievement in optimizing professional, organizational, and ethical practices in pursuit of its mission to support Virginia's hospitals and health systems in advancing the health and well-being of Virginians. VHHA's receipt of this award, which was formally presented during a September 20 ceremony, follows the Association earning the SPQA Progress in Performance Excellence Award in 2020 as part of its multi-year process improvement efforts. The SPQA Achievement in Performance Excellence Award is an honor that recognizes organizations that take meaningful, active steps to build a culture that elevates performance and quality improvement, promotes innovation, and demonstrates measurable results. Receiving consideration for the award requires a significant organizational commitment to growth and process improvement as well as a rigorous, multi-step evaluation process by SPQA examiners who assess and analyze performance and offer observational feedback. The SPQA program is modeled on the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award. Under the leadership of its Board of Directors, VHHA began this process by deploying the Baldrige Performance Excellence Framework in 2017. The Association has continued those efforts by completing the SPQA Self-Assessment process in 2018, leading to the Progress in Performance Excellence Award in 2020, as well as the more recent Achievement in Performance Excellence Award.
