VHHA Holds Meetings of Executive Committee, Board of Directors

• Ahead of the upcoming 2025 Virginia General Assembly session, the VHHA Board of Directors met this week in Richmond for a discussion of public policy issues of interest to hospitals and the health care delivery system. The Board also heard remarks about the federal political and governing landscape from former Congressman **Tom Davis** of the Holland & Knight law firm,

and a briefing on state health policy affairs and updates from **Virginia Health and Human Resources Secretary Janet Kelly**. The **Executive Committee** of the VHHA Board of Directors also met separately this week. VHHA Monitors State Health Insurance Reform Commission Meeting

• VHHA staff this week monitored a meeting of the Virginia Health Insurance Reform Commission (HIRC). Among other items, the meeting agenda included consideration of certain 2025 legislative proposals and a presentation on the impact of the pending expiration of the federal enhanced premium tax credit, which is a refundable tax credit that helps eligible individuals and families cover premium costs for coverage purchased through the Health Insurance Marketplace. The tax credit subsidies were built into the Affordable Care Act of 2010, and provisions of the American Rescue Plan of 2021 temporarily expanded tax credit eligibility. That eligibility enhancement is scheduled to expire in December 2025. Without congressional action in the months ahead, it is projected that marketplace insurance enrollment in 2026 could be impacted and that Virginians who now benefit from the enhancement program would pay more in monthly insurance premiums. Discussion at the HIRC meeting centered on the question of whether Congress will act on the tax credit extension and the potential impact of that on the Commonwealth Health Reinsurance Program and the state budget.

View Recording of EMS Drug Kit Transition Webinar

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS), in collaboration with VHHA and the Virginia Society of Health-System Pharmacists (VSHP), recently hosted the first in a series of planned webinars on the upcoming drug kit transition that will affect Virginia EMS agencies in 2025. Historically, Virginia hospitals and health systems have provided drug kit replenishment to EMS agencies. Pending federal regulatory changes at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) will result in those drug kit services being discontinued. As of now, the transition is scheduled to occur by April 15, 2025. Ahead of that, VHHA and VSHP have participated in the Virginia Regional EMS Medication Kit Transition Workgroup to prepare for that shift. The webinar held this week featured representatives from VDH and Riverside Health System. Webinar presentation slides can be accessed here and a webinar recording can be viewed through this link. News Updates

ASPR Seeking Public Comment on Hospital Preparedness Program Funding Formula

The Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR) is <u>soliciting public comment</u> pertaining to funding for the Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP). The request for comment is part of a process to evaluate, and potentially modify, the HPP funding formula. HPP is a cooperative agreement program that supports health care coalitions in helping to prepare the health care delivery system for emergency response during public health situations that may result in an influx of patients that exceed the day-to-day capacity of health care and emergency response systems. The program is the primary source of federal funding for health care preparedness and response. In Virginia, VHHA oversees the HPP in collaboration with the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). The HPP funding formula is required by statute and includes three components: a base amount determined by the U.S. Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary, a required adjustment based on population, and an amount based on significant unmet need and degree of risk. FDA Issues Recommendations on Approval Process for AI Medical Devices

The **U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) recently issued <u>final recommendations</u> on streamlining the approval process for medical devices that use artificial intelligence. The guidance provides recommendations on information to include in a Predetermined Change Control Plan (PCCP) in a marketing submission for a device that includes one or more AI devise software functions (DSF). FDA guidance does not establish legally enforceable responsibilities; it reflects the agency's current thinking and should be viewed only as recommendations unless specific regulatory or statutory requirements are cited.

CISA, FBI Share Industry Guidance on IT Network Defense Against Cyber Threats

The **Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency** (CISA), the **National Security Agency** (NSA), and the **Federal Bureau of Investigation** (FBI) recently shared <u>guidance</u> with critical industries, including health care, regarding protecting their information technology networks to guard against cyber threats. The guidance comes after CISA, NSA, the FBI, and several international cyber security agencies revealed that malicious cyber actors affiliated with the People's Republic of China compromised networks of major global telecommunications providers as part of a cyber espionage campaign.

HHS Extends Certain COVID-19 Liability Protections to 2029

The **U.S. Department of Health and Human Services** (HHS) recently announced an <u>amendment</u> extending to 2029 a previously issued declaration that provides liability immunity to certain individuals and entities against any claim of loss caused by, arising out of, relating to, or resulting from the manufacture, distribution, administration, or use of medical countermeasures. Provisions of the amendment apply to medical countermeasure activities provided through a federal agreement, as well as to pharmacists, pharmacy interns, and pharmacy technicians who administer COVID-19 and flu vaccines and COVID-19 tests.

DHP: State Law Requires Surgical Technologists to be Certified by Board of Medicine

The **Virginia Department of Health Professions** (DHP) is reminding hospitals and health systems, clinics, ambulatory surgical centers, and other satellite facilities that a <u>state law approved in 2021</u> requires

surgical technologists to be certified by the state **Board of Medicine**. Since the 2021 law took effect, the Board of Medicine has determined that it will accept the credential for surgical technologist/surgical technician from the **National Center for Competency Testing** and from **American Allied Health**.

Register for Dec. 17 'Hope in the ED' Opioid Treatment Program Webinar Featuring Carilion Clinic

Psychiatric and clinical leaders from **Carilion Clinic** will share insights on the success of the Emergency Department Bridge to Treatment program for opioid use disorder patients during a free Dec. 17 webinar. Launched in 2019, the Carilion program model is focused on patients who present in the emergency department with a non-fatal overdose, acute withdrawal symptoms, or those who are requesting treatment. Patients are rapidly connected with follow-up care appropriate to their needs to establish a "bridge" from acute care to post-discharge evaluation and subsequent treatment with the help of Peer Recovery Specialists. Combined with anti-stigma efforts, a review of the bridge program results showed a significant increase in patients accessing outpatient treatment for substance use disorder.
