In related news, Governor Youngkin recently held an <u>event</u> celebrating the two-year anniversary of his Right Help, Right Now program to invest significant new resources in Virginia's behavioral health system.

News Updates

Virginia House Select Committee on Advancing Rural and Small Town Health Care Unveils Report

This week, the **Virginia House Select Committee on Advancing Rural and Small Town Health Care** held a news conference to unveil its report on policy recommendations to enhance health and care delivery in the Commonwealth's rural communities. The Select Committee was impaneled earlier this year by **Virginia House of House of Delegates Speaker Don Scott**. Over the past year, the Select Committee has assessed the state of affairs in rural health and care delivery through site visits and research to understand the challenges and opportunities facing rural health care providers and the communities they serve. VHHA and Virginia's hospitals are deeply invested in strengthening rural care delivery and greatly appreciative to Speaker Scott, **House Health and Human Services Committee Chair Delegate Mark Sickles, Select Committee Chair Delegate Rodney Willett**, and everyone who has worked on this critical initiative. To support that effort, VHHA <u>convened a Rural Health Task Force</u> and produced the <u>Virginia Rural Hospital Report</u> with policy recommendations across areas including behavioral health, maternal health, telehealth, transportation, and workforce development. Continuing Resolution to Fund Federal Government Would Extend Some Health Care Flexibilities

Ahead of a looming deadline, there is uncertainty about whether the **U.S. Congress** will vote to continue funding the federal government through March 14. A tentative compromise on a 1,574-page <u>continuing resolution</u> (HR 10445), which was made public this week, appeared in jeopardy this week as some critics expressed opposition to the measure ahead of an approval deadline today (Friday, Dec. 20) to avoid a potential partial government shutdown. Among health care provisions in the continuing resolution are a delay of Medicare disproportionate share hospital cuts until 2027, an extension of telehealth flexibilities through 2026, a temporary 2.5 percent payment increase under the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule, an expansion of acute-hospital-at-home flexibilities through 2029, and an extension of the Medicare low-volume hospital payment adjustment through 2025. The continuing resolution does not include provisions to reform prior authorization as it relates to Medicare Advantage, site neutral cuts, or new price transparency standards.

HHS Issues Final Rules on Trusted Exchange Framework, Patient Information Sharing

The **U.S. Department of Health and Human Services** (HHS) recently published a pair of final rules. One final rule implements provisions related to the Trusted Exchange Framework and Common Agreement. The rule is intended to advance equity, innovation, and interoperability by promoting the use and exchange of electronically captured health information as specified in certain provisions of the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act of 2009. The final rule will be effective 30 days after it is published in the Federal Register. The other final rule amends the information blocking regulations to revise two existing information blocking exceptions and establish an additional reasonable and necessary activity that does not constitute information blocking referred to as the Protecting Care Access Exception. It is effective Dec. 17, 2024.

ASPR Seeking Public Comment on Hospital Preparedness Program Funding Formula

The Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR) is <u>soliciting public comment</u> pertaining to funding for the Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP). The request for comment is part of a process to evaluate, and potentially modify, the HPP funding formula. HPP is a cooperative agreement program that supports health care coalitions in helping to prepare the health care delivery system for emergency response during public health situations that may result in an influx of patients that exceed the day-to-day capacity of health care and emergency response systems. The program is the primary source of federal funding for health care preparedness and response. In Virginia, VHHA oversees the HPP in collaboration with the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). The HPP funding formula is required by statute and includes three components: a base amount determined by the U.S. Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary, a required adjustment based on population, and an amount based on significant unmet need and degree of risk. CISA, FBI Share Industry Guidance on IT Network Defense Against Cyber Threats

The **Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency** (CISA), the **National Security Agency** (NSA), and the **Federal Bureau of Investigation** (FBI) recently shared <u>guidance</u> with critical industries, including health care, regarding protecting their information technology networks to guard against cyber threats. The guidance comes after CISA, NSA, the FBI, and several international cyber security agencies revealed that malicious cyber actors affiliated with the People's Republic of China compromised networks of major global telecommunications providers as part of a cyber espionage campaign.

HHS Extends Certain COVID-19 Liability Protections to 2029

The **U.S. Department of Health and Human Services** (HHS) recently announced an <u>amendment</u> extending to 2029 a previously issued declaration that provides liability immunity to certain individuals and entities against any claim of loss caused by, arising out of, relating to, or resulting from the manufacture, distribution, administration, or use of medical countermeasures. Provisions of the amendment apply to medical countermeasure activities provided through a federal agreement, as well as to pharmacists, pharmacy interns, and pharmacy technicians who administer COVID-19 and flu vaccines and COVID-19 tests.
