### Register for VHHA-IHI Open School Quality and Patient Safety Certificate Program

Now is the time to register for the latest cohort of the IHI Open School Certificate Program in Quality and Patient Safety offered by the VHHA Center for Healthcare Excellence. Since the first offering in 2021, hundreds of participants have completed the 13 required courses and have been recognized at the annual Virginia Patient Safety Summit. Now in its fourth year, Virginia health care professionals looking to gain quality and patient safety improvement knowledge are invited to register to join the IHI Open School courses to earn a certificate in quality and safety. Content is delivered through narrative, video, and interactive discussion. There are 13 core courses to earn the Basic Quality and Safety Certificate (17.75 CE credits available for the 13 courses) and more than 30 courses available in total for Continuing Education and Specialty Board Certification. The courses offer a dynamic learning environment for health care professionals of all levels and are available as self-paced online modules that are estimated to take 13-22 hours to complete. Those who register will be contacted by e-mail before June 1, 2025, with instructions about how to log in. Participants will have access to all courses from June 1, 2025-May 30, 2026. Those who complete the certificate by Jan. 31, 2026 will be recognized during the 2026 Virginia Patient Safety Summit. The VHHA group rate cost to enroll is \$199 (\$399 without the group rate). # U.S. House Approves Budget Package that Impacts Medicaid Program Funding

After a series of votes and several rounds of negotiation, the U.S. House of Representatives this week narrowly approved the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" budget package endorsed by U.S. President Donald **Trump.** The package extends income tax cuts previously enacted in 2017, invests in border control, and calls for reduced Medicaid and food assistance program spending. This week, the package cleared the House Budget Committee and the House Rules Committee and then won full House approval on a 215-214 vote. The package includes legislation previously approved by the U.S. House Energy and Commerce Committee that contains Medicaid policy changes and funding reductions as part of the broader spending plan. The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) has estimated the proposed Committee legislation would reduce the federal deficit by \$912 billion over a decade, including \$715 billion in savings from reductions in Medicaid. CBO also projects that 13.7 million more individuals could be without health insurance by 2034. That figure includes a projected 4.2 million people who could lose coverage due to the anticipated expiration of expanded Affordable Care Act (ACA) premium tax credits, 1.8 million people due to the impact of the 2025 Marketplace Integrity and Affordability Rule, and a 7.7 million reduction in the number of people with health insurance by 2034 under the Medicaid provisions of the legislation. The legislation would establish more frequent eligibility redeterminations to prevent duplicate enrollment. It would also require certain able-bodied adults ages 19 to 64 without dependents to work at least 80 hours per month or participate in community engagement activities to maintain Medicaid coverage. The proposed legislation seeks to limit the growth of Directed Payment Programs (DPP) while incorporating grandfather clause language that specifies any programs that received written prior approval before the date of enactment would be capped at the levels outlined in its currently approved preprint and State Plan Amendment (SPA). It is the view of VHHA that preserving funding mechanisms such as the State Directed Payment Program is essential for sustaining high-quality and affordable care for Medicaid beneficiaries across the Commonwealth. The draft legislation maintains the current Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) model rather than shifting to per capita caps or block grants. This week's action was preceded by a continuing resolution Congress approved in March to fund the federal government through Sept. 30 and avert a partial government shutdown. That was followed in April by the passage of a modified budget resolution that, among other things, directed the U.S. House Energy and Commerce Committee with jurisdiction over Medicaid and other health care programs to cut at least \$880 billion in spending over time. Now that the U.S. House as passed the legislation, it heads to the U.S. Senate for consideration. The President and House Speaker Mike Johnson reportedly want a deal done by July 4.

### FDA Leaders Offer Revised Guidance on COVID-19 Vaccine Clinical Trials

**U.S. Food and Drug Administration** (FDA) **Commissioner Dr. Marty Makary** and FDA Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research Director **Dr. Vinay Prasad** offered new guidance on "an evidence-based approach to COVID-19 vaccination" in a *New England Journal of Medicine* article published this week. The article notes that the FDA is adopting a regulatory framework in which vaccination occurs "on the basis of immunogenicity — proof that a vaccine can generate antibody titers in people" with the anticipation "that it will be able to make favorable benefit—risk findings for adults over the age of 65 years and for all persons above the age of 6 months with one or more risk factors that put them at high risk for severe" disease outcomes. The guidance further notes that "for all healthy persons...the FDA

anticipates the need for randomized, controlled trial data evaluating clinical outcomes before Biologics License Applications can be granted."

## VDH Seeks Survey Responses to Improve Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome Awareness

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) is seeking survey responses to improve public health reporting and surveillance of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS), which is a condition that affects newborns exposed to opioids or addictive substances in the womb, causing them to experience withdrawal symptoms during their first few days of life. By participating in this brief survey, clinicians will help identify key areas where additional support or resources are needed. This survey will provide valuable insights into the challenges and barriers faced when reporting NAS cases, helping VDH develop better educational tools to support health care providers across the state. All responses will be used for VDH's evaluation efforts and any data shared will be reported in aggregate to ensure privacy. ## **Health Sector Coordinating Council Shares Health Care Cybersecurity Report**

The **Health Sector Coordinating Council** (HSCC) recently shared a new <u>report</u> titled "On the Edge: Cybersecurity Health of America's Resource-Constrained Health Providers." The report highlights how resource-constrained health care systems including small, rural, and critical access hospitals, family clinics, skilled nursing facilities, and federally qualified health centers (FQHC), among others are only marginally prepared for ongoing cyber threats to clinical care and operational liquidity. It also recommends forms of support needed amid stiffer cybersecurity regulatory requirements.
