# FOREWORD

To a lay person, terms like "biotechnology" and "life sciences" may sound technical or unfamiliar. In fact, they are part of our lives in everything from food safety to clinical advancements, and industrial processes. On a global scale, the value of the biotech market was \$1.55 trillion in 2023, with growth expected at a compound annual rate of 13.96 percent from 2024 to 2030. The Virginia biotechnology sector is responsible for more than 1,400 life sciences companies. Overall, the sector contributes \$8 billion to the state economy and employs more than 26,500 people. Biotechnology propels the development of new medicines, cancer treatments, gene therapy, and advances in scientific understanding of serious conditions such as Alzheimer's disease, among many other examples.

To further support that work, a coalition of health care systems, institutions of higher education, and other organizations have united to help launch the Virginia Coordinated Clinical Research Network (VCCRN). The VCCRN was established with an initial investment from the Virginia General Assembly. Its mission is to strengthen collaboration among clinical, academic, and biotechnology and life sciences organizations to accelerate clinical research and trials across the Commonwealth to address health disparities, improve outcomes, and support economic growth. The goal of the inaugural 2025 Virginia Coordinated Clinical Research Summit is to bring together stakeholders across sectors who are "Generating Impact Through Research and Collaboration." We are excited to welcome you and hope that this event and the connections and learnings you gain here inspire you and your work going forward.



#### **Dr. Danny Avula**Mayor **City of Richmond**

Dr. Danny Avula took office as the 81st Mayor of the City of Richmond on January 1, 2025. Before being elected Richmond's first immigrant mayor, Dr. Avula served the Richmond and Henrico Health Districts for 12 years, including as the Director for six years. In that role, he championed efforts to address maternal and childhood health, access to reproductive care, community safety,

and the root causes that shape health outcomes — especially poverty and race.

In January 2021, Virginia Governor Ralph Northam appointed Dr. Avula to lead Virginia's COVID-19 vaccination effort. He jump started a struggling vaccine rollout and elevated the Commonwealth from 50th place to one of the top 10 most-vaccinated states in the nation. After the pandemic started to recede, Virginia Governor Glenn Youngkin appointed Dr. Avula as Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Social Services in 2022, where he implemented key changes to support families and to create more sustainable pathways out of poverty. He also expanded resources through successful legislative advocacy, began the process of replacing outdated IT systems, and ensured employees statewide had the necessary training to offer responsive, high-quality service.

Dr. Avula is a pediatrician and works as a hospitalist at Chippenham Hospital. Born in Hyderabad, India, he immigrated to the United States with his parents in 1979. A father of five, Dr. Avula and his wife, Mary Kay, have lived in Richmond's East End for more than 20 years. Mary Kay is a teacher in Richmond Public Schools.

Dr. Avula holds degrees from the University of Virginia, VCU, and Johns Hopkins. He was named one of Richmond's "Top Docs" each year from 2013-2022, a Richmond Times-Dispatch Person of the Year in 2019, and Style Weekly's Richmonder of the Year in 2020. In 2017, he won the Dancing With the Richmond



#### Sean T. Connaughton President and CEO VHHA

Sean T. Connaughton has served as VHHA President and CEO since 2014. Prior to joining VHHA, he served as Virginia's Transportation Secretary from 2010–2014 in the Cabinet of Governor Robert F. McDonnell.

Connaughton served in a Presidentially-appointed, U.S. Senate-confirmed position as Administrator of the United

States Maritime Administration from 2006-2009, and was Corporate Vice President of Government Affairs for the American Bureau of Shipping. Connaughton's public service also extends to elected office – from 2000-2006, he was Chairman of the Prince William County Board of Supervisors, which is the chief elected position in Virginia's second largest county – and the armed forces.

Connaughton served as a commissioned officer on active duty with the United States Coast Guard, and later joined the United States Naval Reserve, retiring from that service with the rank of Commander. Connaughton is a licensed attorney admitted to practice in Virginia and the District of Columbia. He practiced law for 15 years with private firms and has appeared before the United States Supreme Court.

He has a Bachelor's degree from the United States Merchant Marine Academy, a Master's degree from Georgetown University, a law degree from George Mason University, and he graduated from the United States Naval War College. He also has been designated a Henry Toll Fellow by the Council of State Governments, a Virginia Institute of Political Leadership Fellow, and recently was named a Fellow by the Virginia Law Foundation.

He is married to Teresa and has two adult children: Courtney and Sean Jr.





# Lara D'Antonio Director of Clinical Research Navigation and Executive Director VHHA Foundation and Virginia Coordinated Clinical Reseach Network


Lara D'Antonio joined the VHHA Foundation in July 2022 and serves as the Director of Clinical Research Navigation, a

As CEO, Dr. Edwards has assembled a world-class team committed to providing a solution to the broken essential medicines supply chain and over-reliance on foreign manufacturers for our nation's highest priority medicines.

Dr. Edwards was previously co-founder of Kaléo, Inc. a pharmaceutical company in Richmond, VA. During his 16 years at Kaléo, he held several executive management positions including Chief Science Officer, where he was responsible for overall scientific strategy and all pharmaceutical development programs; Chief Medical Officer responsible for developing a medical affairs team and capability while operationalizing the company's clinical program strategy; and Vice President – Innovation, overseeing Kaleo's research and development pipeline and overall new product strategy.

Dr. Edwards is the co-inventor of multiple marketed products, including AUVI-Q, epinephrine auto-injector for the treatment of allergic emergencies (anaphylaxis), is named on more than 215 issued and patent-pending applications, and is a published author on numerous scientific publications.

Dr. Edwards also continues to serve his community by volunteering on a local rescue squad, including responding to 911 calls and training paramedics in pre-hospital emergency care. He earned a BS in Biology, PhD in the Pharmaceutical Sciences, and Doctor of Medicine degrees at Virginia Commonwealth University/Medical College of Virginia.

#### John Newby CEO Virginia Bio



institutions. Virginia Bio is the sole state affiliate and works closely with key national industry organizations: BIO, AdvaMed, MDMA, PhRMA, and We Work for Health.

Newby was formerly the Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Veterans Services (VDVS), where he led an 850-member agency located across 50 Virginia locations, delivering employment, education, benefits, behavioral health, and long term health care services to Virginia's Reservists, Guardsmen, transitioning service members, and 725,000 veterans.

Prior to leading VDVS, Newby practiced corporate, intellectual property, and Hatch-Waxman biopharmaceutical law at international law firms in Richmond and Washington, D.C., and at a multinational company. Under his leadership, Jeeva's Unified-or-Modular CTMS harnesses advanced artificial intelligence, real-world data, and multilingual clinical research workflows to cut trial timelines by up to 38 percent, reduce site burden by 60 percent, and improve retention among medically underserved populations worldwide.

A serial entrepreneur and rare-disease advocate, Dr. Rajasimha chairs the Indo-US Bridging RARE Summit and advises international patient-advocacy organizations on health equity in research. Honored with the Virginia Innovator of the Year Award, SBIR grants, and recognition from the AWS Healthcare Competency program, Dr. Rajasimha continues to champion data-driven innovation that democratizes access to life-saving treatments. ## Heather Richter, PhD Executive Director Hampton Roads Biomedical Research Consortium



She currently serves as Central Virginia Site Lead for the National VA Women's Health Research Network, Regional GYN Community of Practice Lead Consultant, and sits on the U.S. National Surgery Office's Surgical Advisory Board for OBGYN. Dr. Siff has authored many peer-reviewed publications and award-winning oral presentations and is honored to have received several awards for peer-review, clinical excellence, bedside manner, teaching, teamwork, and compassion.
